Organized Travelers are Happy Travelers

- If traveling by air, plan where to store vital papers (passport, plane tickets, birth certificate copy) before leaving home. Ensure they are within easy reach and NOT in your luggage. Return them to the same place each time you use them.
- Take 5 minutes to fully unpack when you arrive at your hotel room so you can see everything you brought.
- Traveling in the car, utilize vertical trunk space by using an open bin or basket in the trunk for small items that would otherwise roll around and take up floor space, such as umbrellas, tote bags, extra snacks or water. After you've returned home, this same sort of system keeps groceries from escaping their bags and roaming free.
- Always leave some empty luggage space on the outbound trip to handle gifts and treasures you'll be bringing back.
